

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF NEW BERLIN, UNION COUNTY,
PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A CURFEW FOR CHILDREN UNDER
SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE; PROHIBITING ADULTS FROM PERMITTING
CHILDREN TO VIOLATE CURFEW; PROVIDING FOR THE DETENTION
OF CHILDREN WHO ARE IN VIOLATION OF CURFEW; AND PRESCRIBING
PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF CURFEW.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Mayor and Borough Council of the
Borough of New Berlin, Union County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted
and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person under sixteen (16)
years of age to be or remain upon any public street, alley or other public place
in the Borough after 11:00 o'clock P.M., unless such minor is:

- a. accompanied by a parent or guardian, or other person having
custody of such minor;
- b. in the performance of a duty directed by such parent or guardian,
or other person having custody;
- c. in the performance of a matter of necessity or emergency; or
- d. in lawful employment making it necessary to be in such place after
11:00 o'clock P.M.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for anyone having the legal care and
custody of any such minor to allow or permit such minor to go or be upon any
public street, alley or other public place in the Borough after 11:00 o'clock
P.M., except as provided in the preceding section.

Section 3. Every member of the police force of the Borough while on
duty is hereby authorized to detain any such minor wilfully violating the
provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance until the parent or guardian, or other
person having custody of such minor shall take him or her into custody; but
such officer shall immediately upon detaining any such minor communicate with
the parent or guardian, or other person having custody of such minor.

Section 4. Any person violating the provisions of Section 2 of this
Ordinance shall upon conviction in a summary proceeding before a magistrate

is sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars for each offense, plus costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine and costs, to be imprisoned for a period not in excess of ten (10) days.

Section 5. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon enactment.


